Transformation in History

- First: personal transformation with vision of the Lordship of Christ over all of society
- Then persecution, sometimes for centuries
- Followed sometimes by transformation

± 60% of all martyrs died in 20th century.

Let us count the cost before we continue...

YES, LORD JESUS

- I want Your will; nothing more, nothing less, nothing else. By Your grace, I will:
 - Stay where You put me
 - Go where You send me
 - Do what You command me
 - Sacrifice what You gave me
 - Suffer what You require of me
 - Die when You want, in the way You choose for me
- Love God and neighbour with all I am + have

Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, and does not stand in the way of sinners, and does not sit in the seat of scorners. But his delight is only in the Torah of JHWH, and he meditates in His Torah day and night.

And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivulets of

waters, which will give its fruit in its seasons, and its leaf will not wither, and all which he does will prosper. Not so are the wicked, but they are only as chaff which the wind drives about. Therefore the wicked shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the tzadikim.

For JHWH knows the way of the tzadikim, and the way of the wicked shall perish.

Torah is for the tzadikim


- Torah: God's wisdom (vision + guidelines) for a society that is ultimately answerable to Him
- Tzadikim: those who apply God's wisdom and as a result are holy and righteous people who act accordingly
- Transformation through Torah!
- Jesus Christ is Torah

WORLDVIEW BELIEFS LIVE IN HEARTS

- Watch your heart above all things, for from it flows the springs of life, Prov. 4: 23
- For with the heart one believes unto righteousness and with the mouth one confesses unto salvation, Rom. 10: 10

EACH OF US IS A WORLDVIEW TREE

- Our own worldview
 - What have others to put into your tree?
 - What food/care are you giving your tree?
- The worldview tree of our disciples
 - Our concentric circles of influence
 - Intentional or incidental influence
 - Cross-generational or not

SOCIETY IS A WORLDVIEW FOREST

- Reflects majority of society/community
- Reflects counter-trends as well
- Changes in worldview forests are slow but can be accelerated by storms
- Transformation inside out in right direction possible through God's truth

WORLDVIEW – BRIEF DEFINITIONS

- 1. A sacred canopy under which one can live (Berger)
- 2. A map of reality that is used as a map for living (Geertz)
- 3. Foundational framework about reality used to order life (Hiebert)

Sought: Torah-based Framework

WORLDVIEW AND BEHAVIOUR

- Worldview is what you really believe
- What you **do** reveals what you really believe
- The larger the gap between professed beliefs and actual beliefs, the more serious the case of hypocrisy

- 1. Answers Ultimate Questions: Belief sets
- 2. Provides security for Emotional Crises
- 3. Gives Validation of Cultural Norms
- 4. Integrates Culture into a Sensible Whole





REPENTANCE

No cheap grace but life-long process of repentance (individual and corporate)

HOW DO YOU KNOW YOUR BELIEFS ABOUT HEALTHCARE ARE TRUE?

- Position: I am the PROFESSOR
- Experience: I have done this for thirty years
- Recommendation: Experts agree with me
- Qualifications: I have more degrees than you
- Research: I have done double-blind trials
- Faith: My holy books says so
- Casuistry: My aunt used it and it is fantastic

OUR DISTORTED WORLDVIEW

- Abortion is OK if you use it as a family planning method or if it is legal in your country
- After prayer, I had peace to practice euthanasia on the patient
- It is OK to take medicines from the hospital because they do not pay me enough here
- It is unethical to share the Good News about Jesus Christ with sick people and definitely wrong to introduce Him to terminally ill persons

What is the distortion in each of the above?

Our distorted worldview

- It is OK to treat patients disrespectfully if they:
 - —Are stupid / poor / ugly / stinking / dishonest
 - Do stupid things
 - Belong to another faith / tribe / caste / class
 - Are female / children
 - —Are unconscious / psychotic / demented

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATING WORLDVIEWS


- 1. Explains what it ought to explain (ultimate questions & concerns)
- 2. Internal logical consistency (does not contradict itself)
- 3. Factual adequacy (not built upon falsehoods)
- 4. Existential viability (can be believed)
- 5. Intellectual / cultural fruitfulness (promotes thought / creativity)
- 6. Fundamentally stable (does not morph / change at a whim)
- 7. Tends to have simpler explanations rather than unnecessarily complex ones

- Corruption Perception Index 2012


Worldview affects everyday life!




Human Development Index 2013: Best development = 1,00

37 'Islamic' states – average = 0,62

22 Western Europe states – average = 0,88





Corruption Perceptions Index 2013: Least Corrupt = 100; Most Corrupt = 0 37 'Islamic' states – average = 34 22 Western Europe states – average = 73

Stoicheia: elements; basic parts / components

Salvation	Save yourself	God saves you
Human nature	Good	Lost
Image bearer	Of self	Of God
Deepest Need	Self-realization	Love God and neighbour
Love	Seek happiness, prosperity, virtue, enlightenment	Sacrificial choice and action for highest good for other
