

# Habakkuk

- Jesus, the God of my Salvation!
- The “doubting Thomas of the OT”
- He saw different problems – but took it to God!
- Habakkuk = “someone who embraces God and clings to Him”!!!
- He asked: “Lord, are You there? ...Lord, do You care? ...Lord, is it fair?”

SINGING

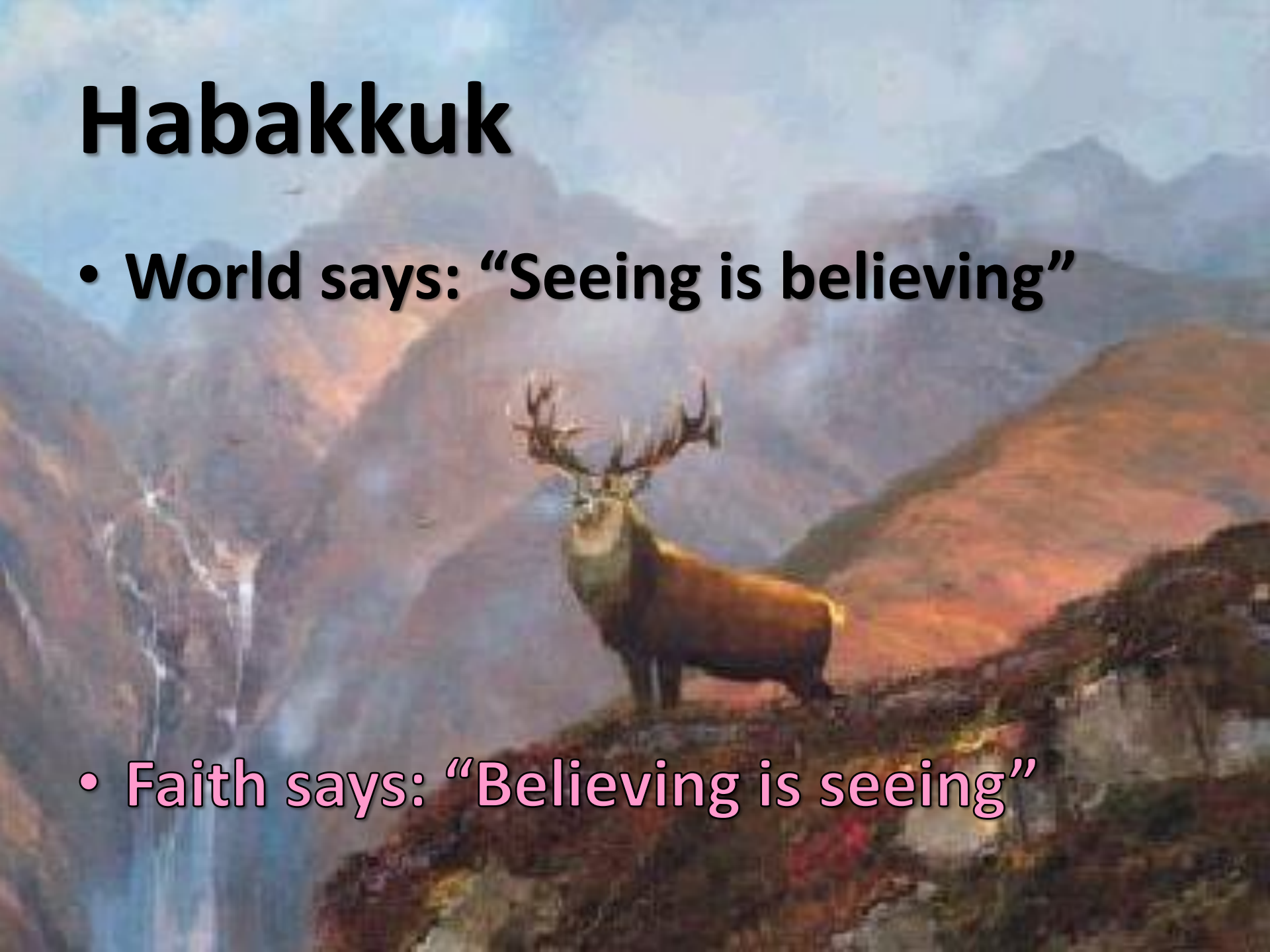




# Habakkuk

- The prophet is TROUBLED  
(Habakkuk 1)

- The prophet is TRIUMPHANT  
(Habakkuk 3)

# Habakkuk

- The prophet is TROUBLED
  - By the crimes of Judah
  - By the coming of the Chaldeans
- The prophet is TAUGHT that God is righteous...
  - Individually
  - Internationally
- The prophet is TRIUMPHANT
  - Faith Surrenders
  - Faith Sees
  - Faith Soars



# Habakkuk

- “The just shall live by faith” (2:4b) – by going on believing...!
- “Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbour” (2:15)
- “Though the fig tree does not blossom and there is no fruit on the vines, [though] the product of the olive fails and the fields yield no food, though the flock is cut off from the fold and there are no cattle in the stalls, Yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the [victorious] God of my salvation!” (3:17-18)


# Habakkuk 3:19

- “The Lord God is my Strength, my personal bravery, and my invincible army; He makes my feet like hinds' feet and will make me to walk [not to stand still in terror, but to walk] and make [spiritual] progress upon my high places [of trouble, suffering, or responsibility]! For the Chief Musician; with my stringed instruments.”
