Your response as a Church to addicts.

Dear friends,

With Health Care Sunday we have a special opportunity to look at the role of the church in health care. Most churches do have a number of health care workers as members and they often play a role in the promotion of health in the church or help to care for the sick.

This year I want to focus on addiction and how it affects the church. Different types of addiction are sometimes found in the church, for example smoking and alcohol abuse. But there are other addictions which can be a pitfall for the Christian community such as gambling, pornography, excessive eating and illegal drugs. The use of weed or marihuana has been legalised recently in South Africa. What is the response or the answer of your congregation to the substance use in your community or among the youth of the church? Is substance use of weed, nyaope, heroine, tic or other drugs a problem in your community? Does it affect your church or your community and how? Have you a plan to show that as a Christian community you care and show compassion and bring hope?

This week I met with a man in hospital who has been addicted to illegal drugs for years and was begging on the streets of Pretoria. When he finally collapsed on the street, people called an ambulance

and he was admitted to hospital. Up to that time he had refused any help from COSUP (a harm reduction programme In Tshwane) or any other source. Now he was without drugs for 10 days, examined by a doctor and a social worker had traced his sister who was sitting beside his bed. To my joy there was a young woman from the Living Word Church congregation in Pretoria who showed

interest, compassion and brought Hope. After receiving ministry from her, he showed interest in starting a new life with his sister in another city.

This incident underlines the importance of church members taking a spiritual interest in suffering humanity.

Rescue those who are being taken away to

death; hold back those who are stumbling to the slaughter (Proverbs 24:11).


