
Judges

- Last verse: "…every man did that which was right …<u>in his own eyes</u>…" (21:25)

General Lessons

- They started well (in Canaan), but didn't finish well.
- They forsook the Lord and followed other gods.
- They were **not steadfast** in their relationship with God.
- **"Doing my own thing**" always leads to disaster!
- Man's natural trend is not upwards, but downwards... ☺

General Lessons

- They **did NOT** drive out the enemy completely as God commanded!! (Ch 1)
- They **mixed** with the ungodly nations!!
- The **wickedness** of the human heart...
- God specializes in using the weak things, the "small"...
- The **Holy Spirit** came upon men and equipped and used them!
- God's amazing mercy...(
 ← repentance)

General Lessons

• "The Lord did not drive them out at once... These are the nations the Lord left to TEST all those Israelites who had not experienced any of the wars in Canaan (He did this only to TEACH warfare to the descendants of the Israelites who had not had previous battle experience)..." (2:23;3:1-2)
