- Ethical behaviour: sought best for the other, took care, kept his word, came back




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- But: I cannot become involved, make sacrifices, cross barriers...




ALL CHRISTIANS LIVE IN A LARGE MANSION $_{(\text{C.S. LEWIS})}$

2.Patient-appropriate


- Patient/Person not in the centre, Christ is
- Our view of humans: Genesis 1: 26-28
- Appropriate:
 - 1. Fitting this patient in this situation at this time
 - 2. Dis-ease story: looking for the roots
 - 3. Life story: personal, community
 - 4. Relationships story: vertical, horizontal, internal

Bible Aspects of Whole Human Being 1

- Spirit: <u>ruach</u> (seat of emotion, seat of mental acts, seat of moral character, disposition, that which departs at death); <u>pneuma</u> (principle of life as flowing from God, mind)
- Soul: nephesh (whole person, inner being with its thoughts and emotions, animating force of a person's body); psyche (principle of natural life, life itself, mind, feelings, seat of senses, desires, affections, appetites, passions)

Bible Aspects of Whole Human Being 2
 Body: geviyah/nephesh/muth; soma (an organized whole made up of parts and members, living physical body, sometimes dead
 body, body = church) Flesh: <u>sarx</u> (flesh of a body, seat of sinful
affections and appetites, physical/moral weakness or imperfection, proneness to sin)

Bible Aspects of Whole Human Being 3
 Heart: <u>leb/lebab</u> (physical organ, seat of one's inner nature as well as component of inner self
such as will, mind, emotions); kardia (seat and centre of human life – of desires, feelings,
affections, passions, impulses, mind, will)
 Mind: nephesh/lebab/ruach/peh; nous/dianoia / sophroneo (organ of mental perception and
apprehension, of conscious life, intelligent understanding, thought, mode of thinking and
feeling)
Bible Aspects of Whole Human Being 4
 Womb/belly: <u>behten</u> (seat of mental faculties), <u>rechem</u> (lit. womb), <u>racham</u> (womb,
compassion); metra, koilia (lit. belly, also innermost part of human, soul, heart, seat of
thought, feeling, choice)
 Kidneys: <u>kesel</u> (loins, confidence, stupidity) Loins: <u>chalats</u> / <u>yarek</u> / (seat of procreative
power, the virtue of acting like a man, being stable, strong, determined, taking a rebuke like
a man); osphus (procreative power, readiness)
 Marrow: <u>shiqquy</u> (vigour, renewal); <u>muelos</u>

3.Staff-enabling

- · Enabling, not exploiting
- Total Staff Care in relevant areas:
 - -Relationships: teams, multi-professional
 - Management: work load, scheduling, organizational structure, pro-active
 - -Finance: salary, insurance, pension
- Learning environment
- Career planning and implementation


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
- Hospital ←→ Healthcare ←→ Home

8. Care-focused • Total Patient Care encompasses personal health, family health, health promotion, community health, public health, primary secondary and tertiary healthcare, intra and extramural care • Integrates the above with church involvement in healthcare • Healing not always possible; Care is • Ultimate aim of both Care and Cure: Shalom • Shalom includes all forms of healing, including miraculous healing and a victorious death	





9. Ethics-contoured

Theological basis: Matthew 22: 37-39
Total Ethics: How should we love our neighbour in healthcare?

As a science: Reverent, systematic, analytical and critical thinking about attitudes, decisions and behaviour of healthcare professionals.

We consider four basic perspectives: virtues, situations, duties and consequences

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- Total Patient Care: As many aspects of aesthetics as possible in as many areas of healthcare as possible
- · Architecture, interior decoration, dress code
- Therapy: Music therapy, creativity therapy, occupational therapy (design element)

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- Four types of law: Self-made, Society-made, Legal system-made and God-made
- Total Patient Care:
 - Recognizes self-made and society-made laws can be detrimental to health
 - Obeys legal system-made laws as long as they do not go against God-made laws
 - Challenges and changes legal systems to align with God's laws
 - Submits wholly to God's Torah

12.Budget-sustainable

- Relationism is a viable Christian alternative to capitalism or socialism
- Relationism deals with the tension between responsibility and solidarity much better than either capitalism or socialism
- Budgets need to be balanced in such a way that they will be sustainable also in the long term

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13. Environment-friendly

- In developed countries we discovered what we had after we lost it
- Major problem in many developing countries are you going to follow the disastrous Western example of exploiting God's creation? Most are doing it...
- · Waste and garbage disposal, public health
- Pharmaceutical world major challenges

14. Technology-served

- Make optimal use of technology for the greatest good of the most
- Technology within the contours of Total Ethics is of major benefit
- Outside those contours it is a life-threatening monster
